2024 Terry Fox Humanitarian Award Winners Announced

Students selected to receive the prestigious scholarship include advocates for education, mental health and marginalized people

Toronto, ON, Monday, May 27, 2024 – Fourteen young humanitarians with the potential to change the world have been selected as winners of the 2024 Terry Fox Humanitarian Award.

Established in 1982, the prestigious scholarship is awarded annually to students who exemplify the humanitarian ideals of Terry Fox by volunteering and giving back to their communities. The program supports each student's journey towards their first degree to enable them to continue their important work for the benefit of society.

"Terry Fox showed us what one person can accomplish for the greater good, even when the odds are stacked against them," said Paulina Chow-White, Executive Director, Terry Fox Humanitarian Award Program. "This year's extraordinary Terry Fox Humanitarian Award winners have already made substantial contributions to humanitarian issues in their communities and beyond. They will join a community of past recipients all focused on continuing Terry Fox's heroic legacy of bettering humanity through dedication and perseverance."

Ranging in age from 16 to 22 years old, and hailing from regions across Canada, this year's award winners have each persevered through significant personal challenges and have emerged as strong and inspiring changemakers. This year's cohort includes advocates for marginalized people, mental health, education access, food security, medical and health research, and the right to practice one's faith.
